### **Academic Screening**

- Academic screening will be held Tuesday May 29th- Thursday 31st by appointment only.
- Screening appointments will be scheduled at the April registration.
- The academic screening appointment will last approximately 45-60 minutes.
- Your child will work in our library with various members of the kindergarten staff.

### What do we use as a screening tool?

 DIAL-4: Developmental Indicators for the Assessment of Learning, 4<sup>th</sup> edition © 2011

 Assesses development in 3 domains: language, motor, concepts

 A child's performance is compared to his/her peers within a 2 month chronological age span

#### What Does the DIAL-4 Look Like?

#### Motor Station:

- Gross motor:
  - catching
  - jumping
  - hopping
  - skipping
- Fine motor:
  - building with blocks
  - cutting
  - copying shapes and letters
  - writing

#### What Does the DIAL-4 Look Like?

#### Language Station:

- Answer simple questions about him/herself
- Pronunciation of words
- Naming and/or identifying common actions/objects
- Identifying some letters and letter sounds
- Rhyming
- Identifying pictures with a specific first sound from a picture scene

#### What Does the DIAL-4 Look Like?

#### Concepts:

- Pointing to named body parts
- Naming colors
- Oral counting
- Counting objects
- Identifying concepts in pictures (e.g. biggest, smallest etc)
- Sorting shapes

#### Results

- After the week of academic screening is complete, all parents will receive a letter regarding their child's performance.
- For each area (motor, language, concepts) your child's score will be described as:
  - Age-appropriate
  - At some risk
  - At risk

...as compared to other children born within the same 2 month span...

# Results of the academic screening are intended to:

- Provide parents with information regarding their child's performance in each area <u>as compared to similar-age peers</u>
- Provide the school and Kindergarten staff with information that is helpful in creating class placements with a good balance of children's strengths and needs
- Provide the school with information that may be helpful in determining whether or not a child may need to be re-screened in the fall for supplemental services through our regular education process (e.g. speech, occupational therapy, literacy intervention etc.)








# What is PBIS and why are we implementing it at our school?

PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) is a way for schools to encourage good behavior. With PBIS, kids learn about behavior, in the same way they learn other subjects like math or science. The key to PBIS is prevention in a multi-tiered approach.

- Positively stated rules and reminders (visuals) throughout our school.
- Consistency in our expectations and improvements in our students' behavior.
- Clearly defined procedures and processes throughout the building.

- School wide and classroom matrices

# Social Thinking

#### What is it?

• "The ability to consider your own and others thoughts, emotions, beliefs, intentions, and knowledge to help interpret and respond to the information in your mind and possibly through your social interactions" (Garcia Winner, 2015).

#### Why is it important for our children to cultivate these skills?

 The ability to do "social thinking" hugely affects our lives as it often determines our relationships, our happiness, and our success.
